# The Fire Triangle

It takes three things, working together, to cause a fire:

**Fuel,** or something that will burn **Heat,** or something that is hot **Oxygen,** which is the air that we all breathe

When you take one of these things away, the fire goes out.

To know how to put out a fire, or stop it from starting in the first place, we must understand how removing one side of the triangle will stop a **fire**.

If you stop putting wood on a camp fire, the fire will go out. You have taken away the fuel source.

When a **firefighter** puts **water** on a fire, it cools it. By cooling it, you have reduced the heat source so it will not **burn** any more.

If your clothes catch on fire, you should **stop**, **drop** and **roll** to put the fire out. This causes a lack of oxygen, or **air**, which will **smother** the fire and put it out.

Smoke from a fire contains **toxic**, or **poison gases**. Breathing this toxic, poisonous smoke, even for a minute, can cause death.




