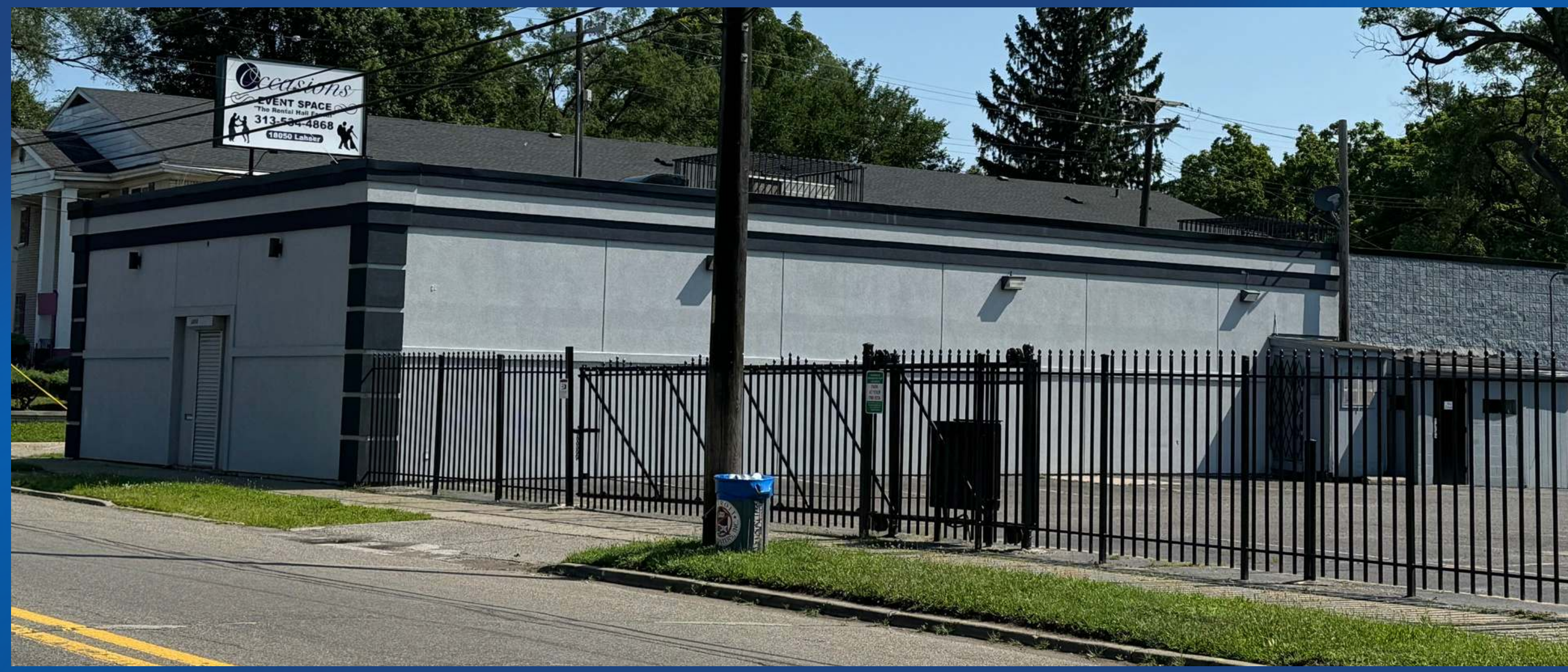

- **Civil Rights** and other powerful movements for social change have involved youth and young voices
- A **17-year-old** took the cellphone video of Minneapolis Police killing George Floyd in 2020

Why the Board of Police Commissioners started YAP

- For years, the Board held meetings at K-12 and college campuses, hired high school or college interns, and did other youth engagement
- The Youth Advisory Panel helps ensure youth are involved all the time in the Charter-mandated mission of the Board.

- Ages **15-25** years old

- City **residency** required

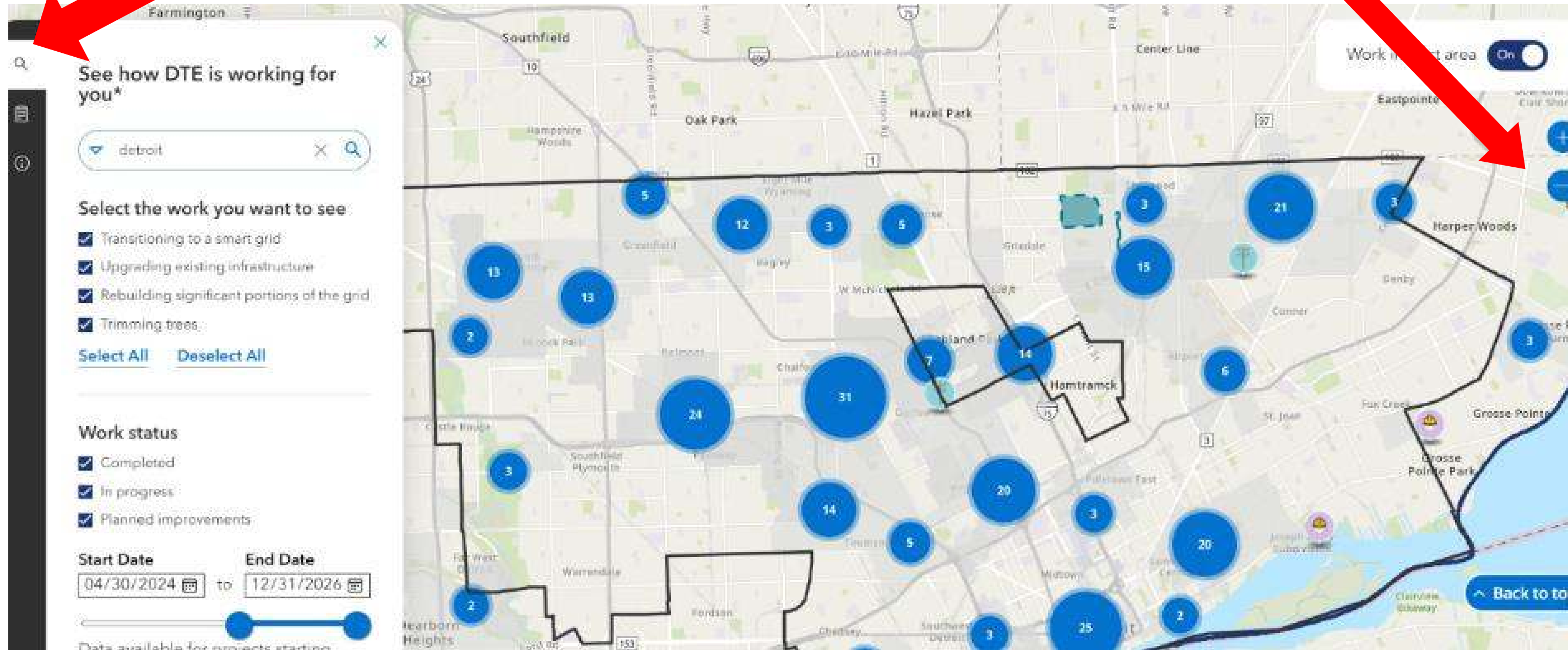

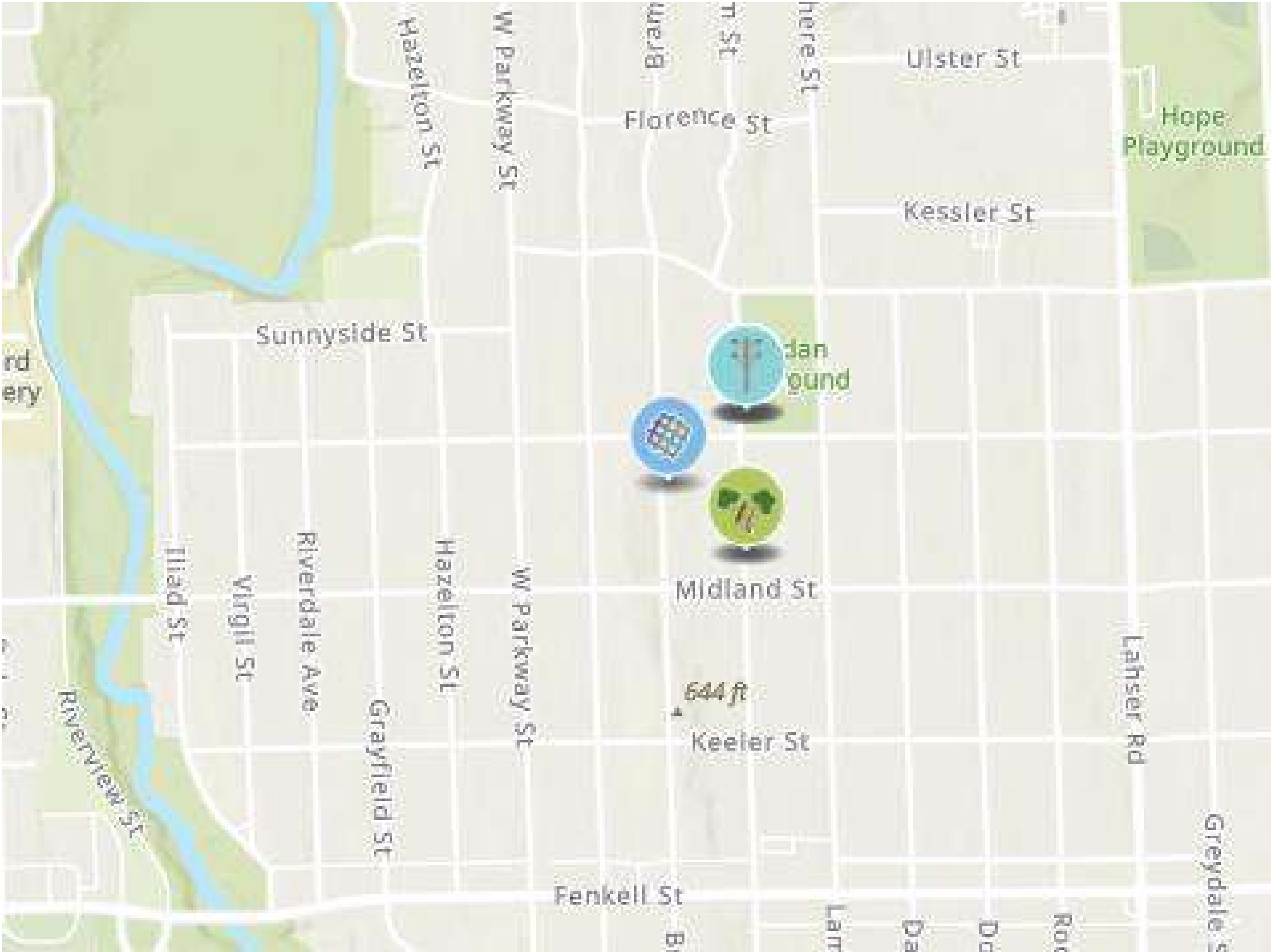

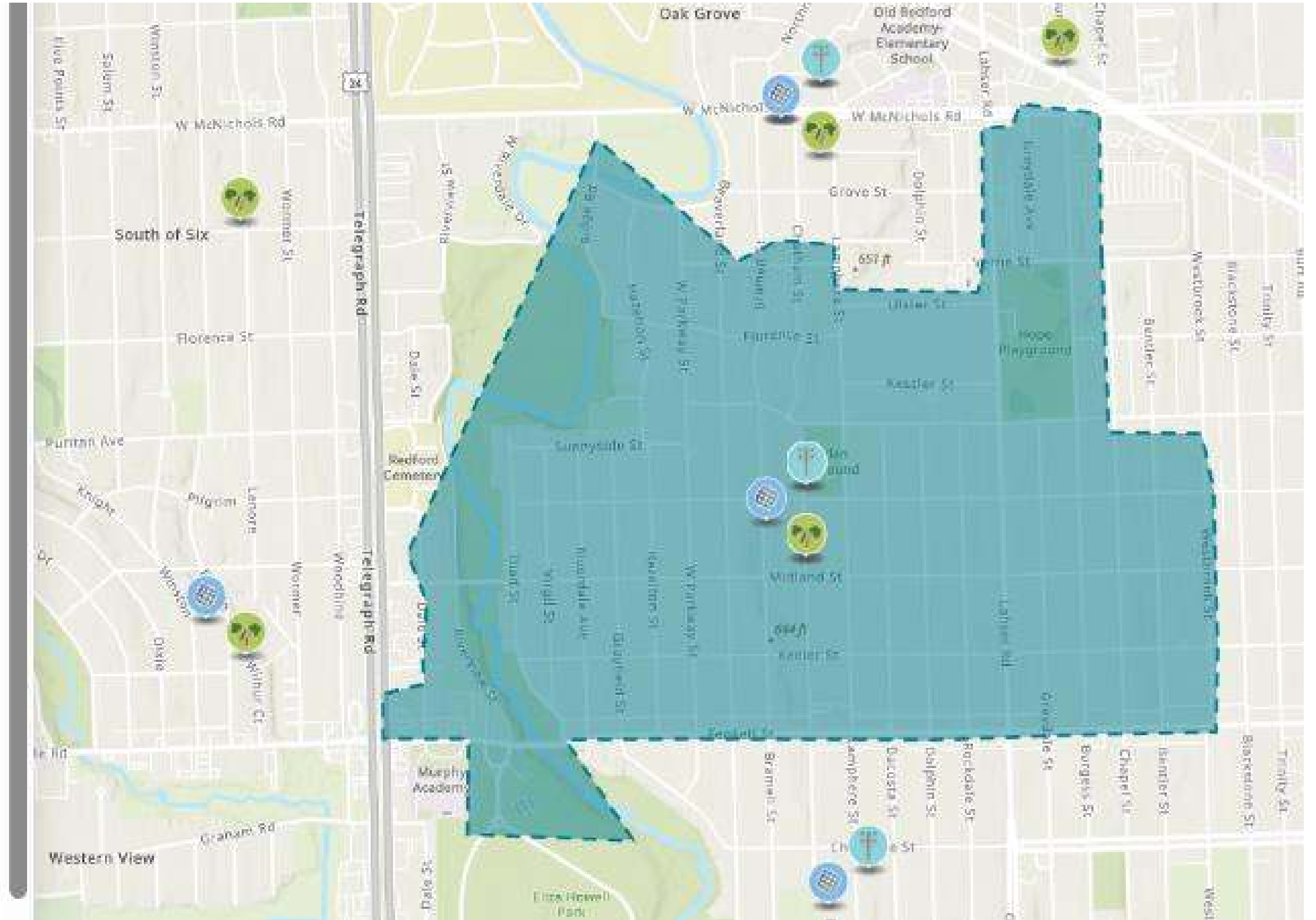

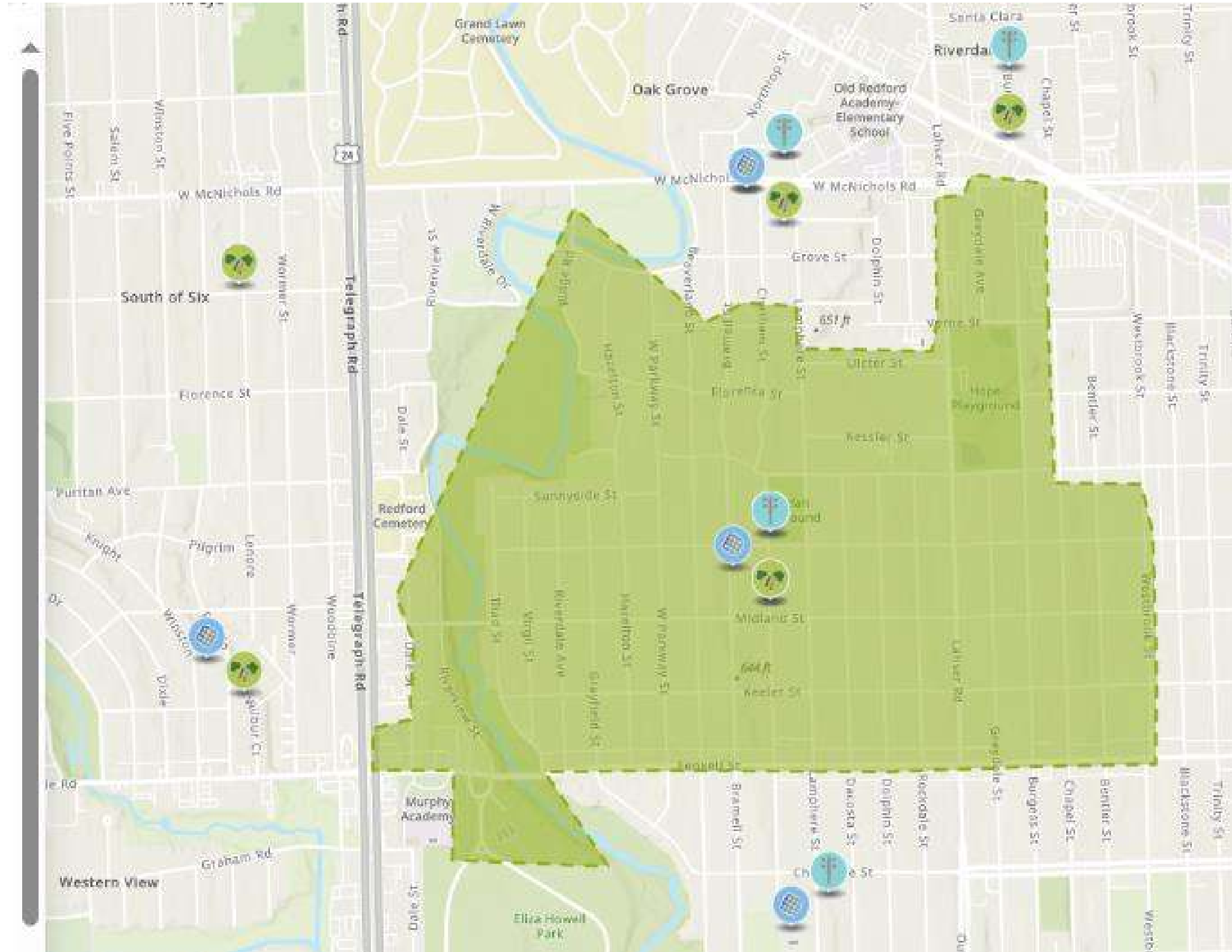

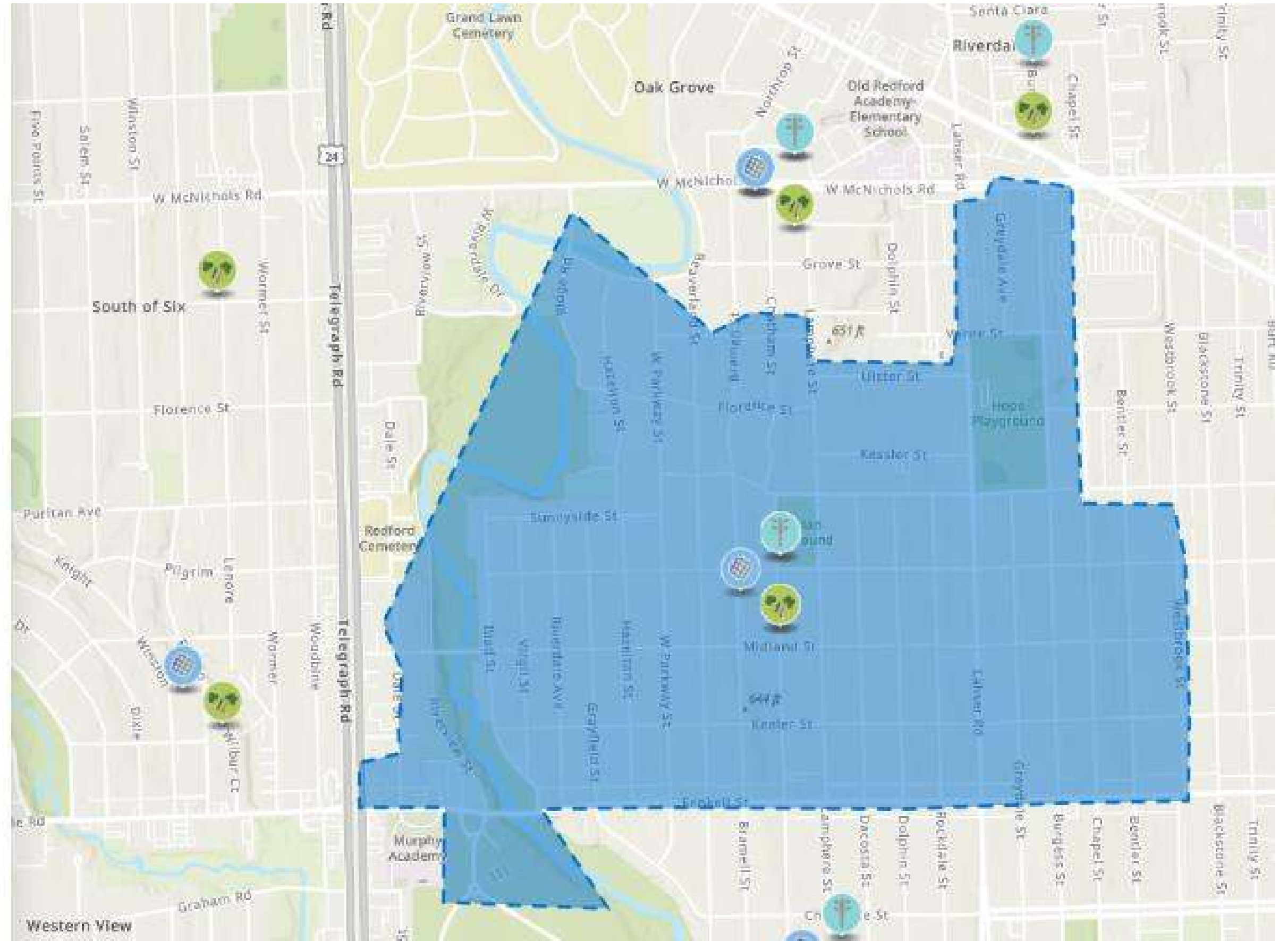

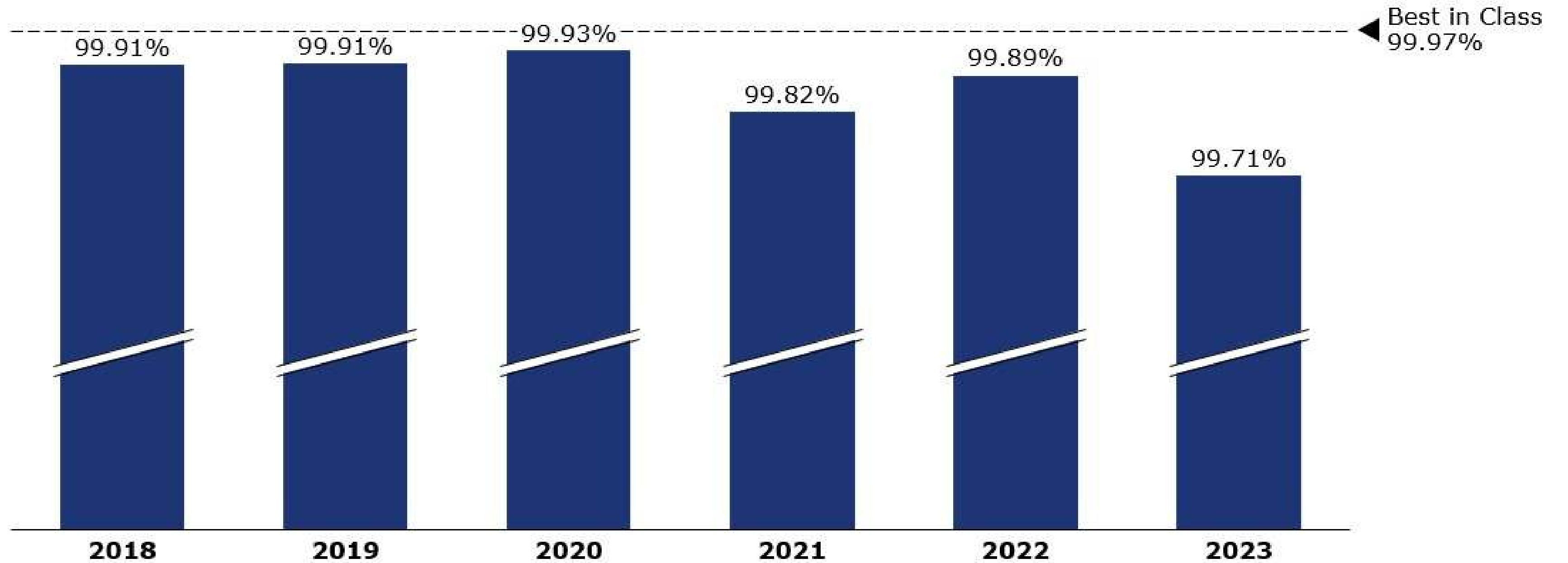

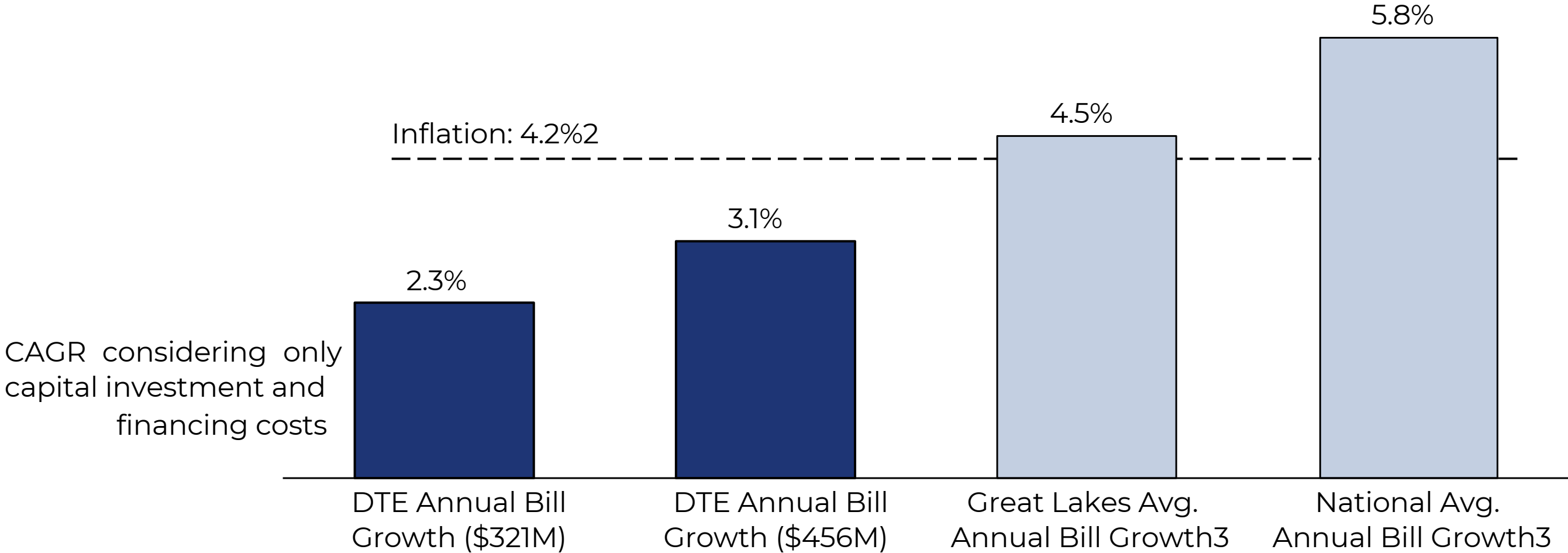


DTE's bills remained below the national average in 2023

SENIOR UPDATE



- Age 65+, the **WINTER PROTECTION PROGRAM** applies. Services can not be shut for non-payment from Nov 1 – March 31, however, charges will still accrue and be due after March 31. If you are listed as the account owner, this should be automatically applied to your account when you reach age 65. (Customers age 62 prior to October 31, 2023 will remain eligible for program)

At age 65+, The **SENIOR PROVISION CREDIT** of \$4.25/mo applies to your electric account. No usage requirement applies, savings of \$51 per year. If you are already receiving a \$7.50 RIA (Residential Low Income) credit on your electric bill, this will not be applicable (i.e. will not layer on top of the \$7.50). This is NOT automatically applied - Call **800-477-4747** to request this provision credit if you are eligible

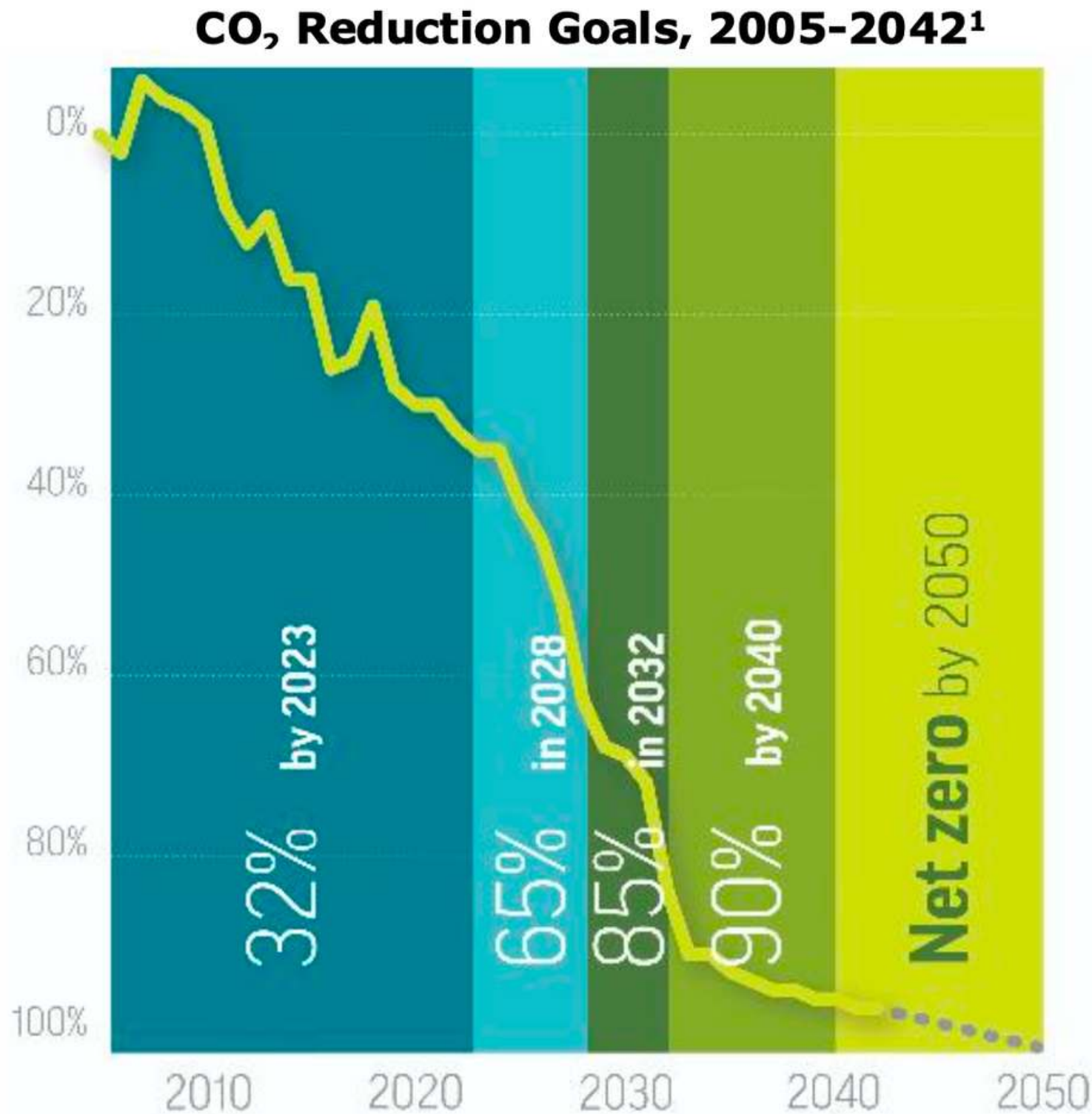

- Fiber backbone system that connects critical infrastructure locations
- Wireless mesh networks that support meter feedback
- As more smart devices are installed, more communication technology will be required to connect with it



Getting power restored FASTER and having REAL TIME DATA

- Reclosers started going in this JUNE (placed at the beginning of circuits)
- Target 200 by end of 2023
- Next step 2025– adding more devices to the midsection of the circuits (further sectionalizing with AUTOMATION capability).
- Devices can help determine if we have an OVERHEAD or UNDERGROUND issue.
- Understand the real-time load of all circuits to allow for improved jumpering and switching plans

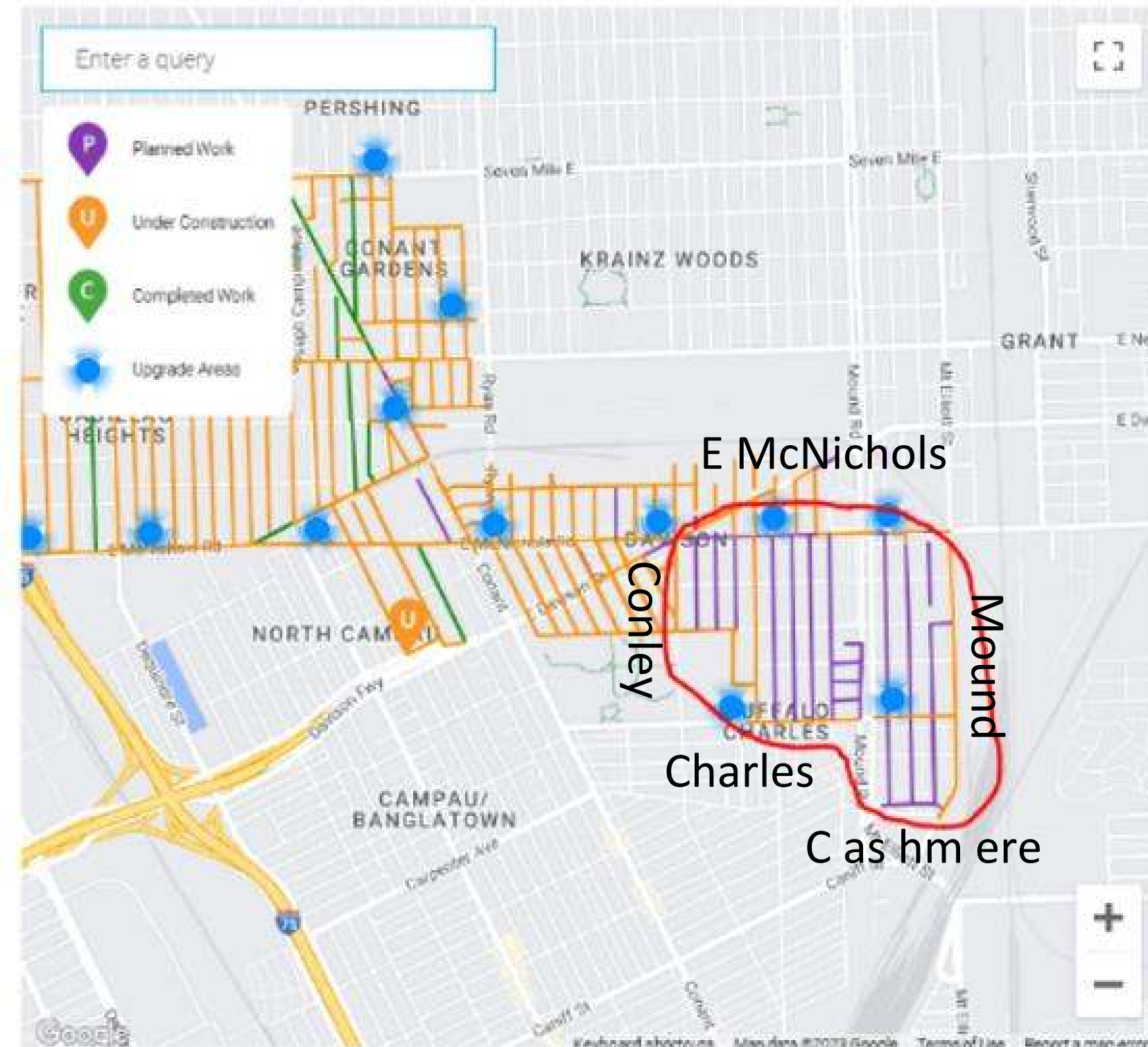

- Anticipated construction start is Summer 2025



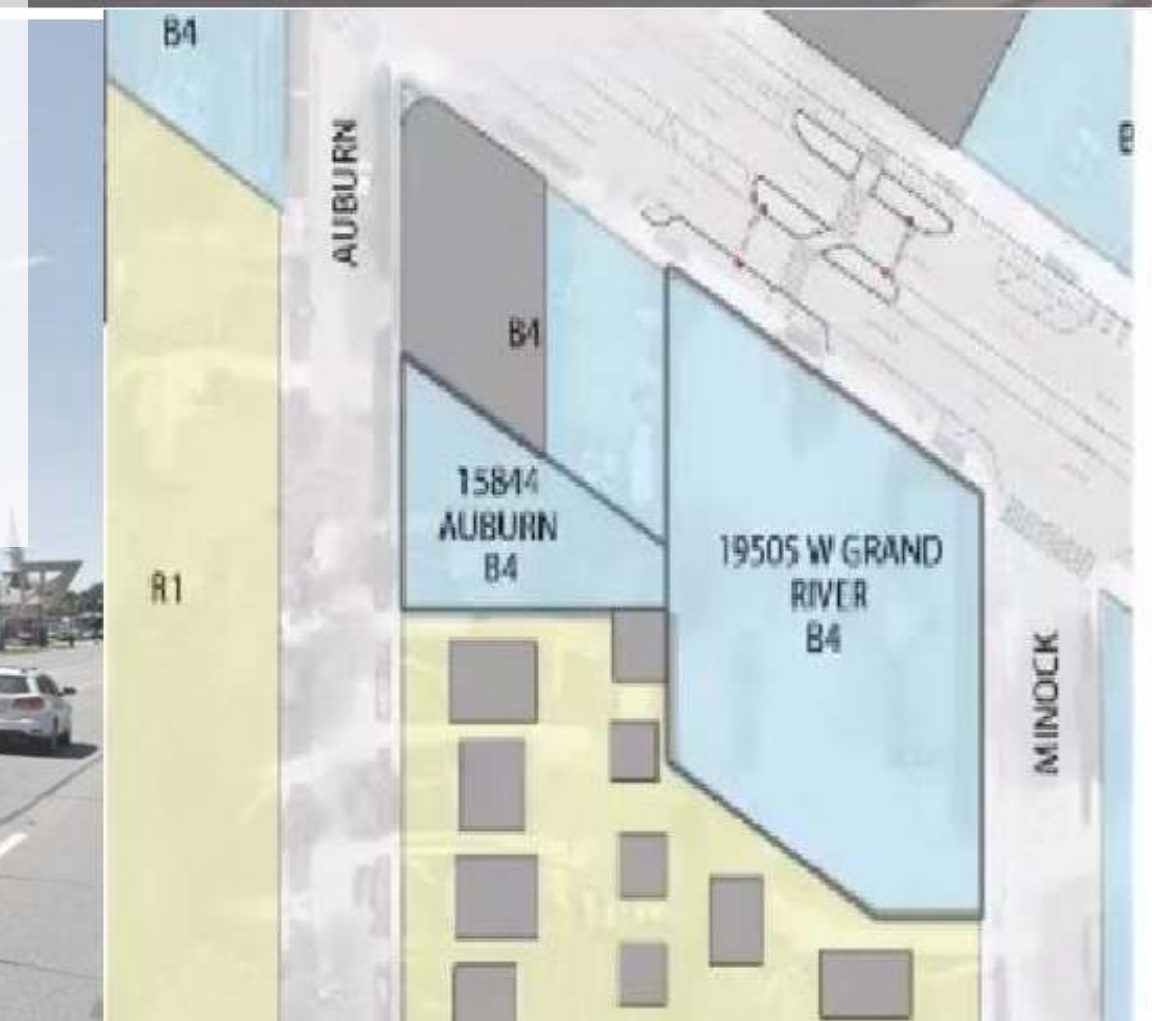
ORCHARD VILLAGE

Why the Census matters?

Census count determines

federal funding for: **Medicaid, WIC, Bridge Cards, Section 8, Grants for Police, Fire, Health, CDBG**

\$5,000 in estimated federal funding lost each year for every person not counted

Population for cities and townships is determined by Housing Units

Housing Unit (HU)

- A single-family house, townhouse, mobile home, trailer, apartment, group of rooms, or a single room occupied as a separate living quarter or, if vacant, intended for occupancy as a separate living quarter.

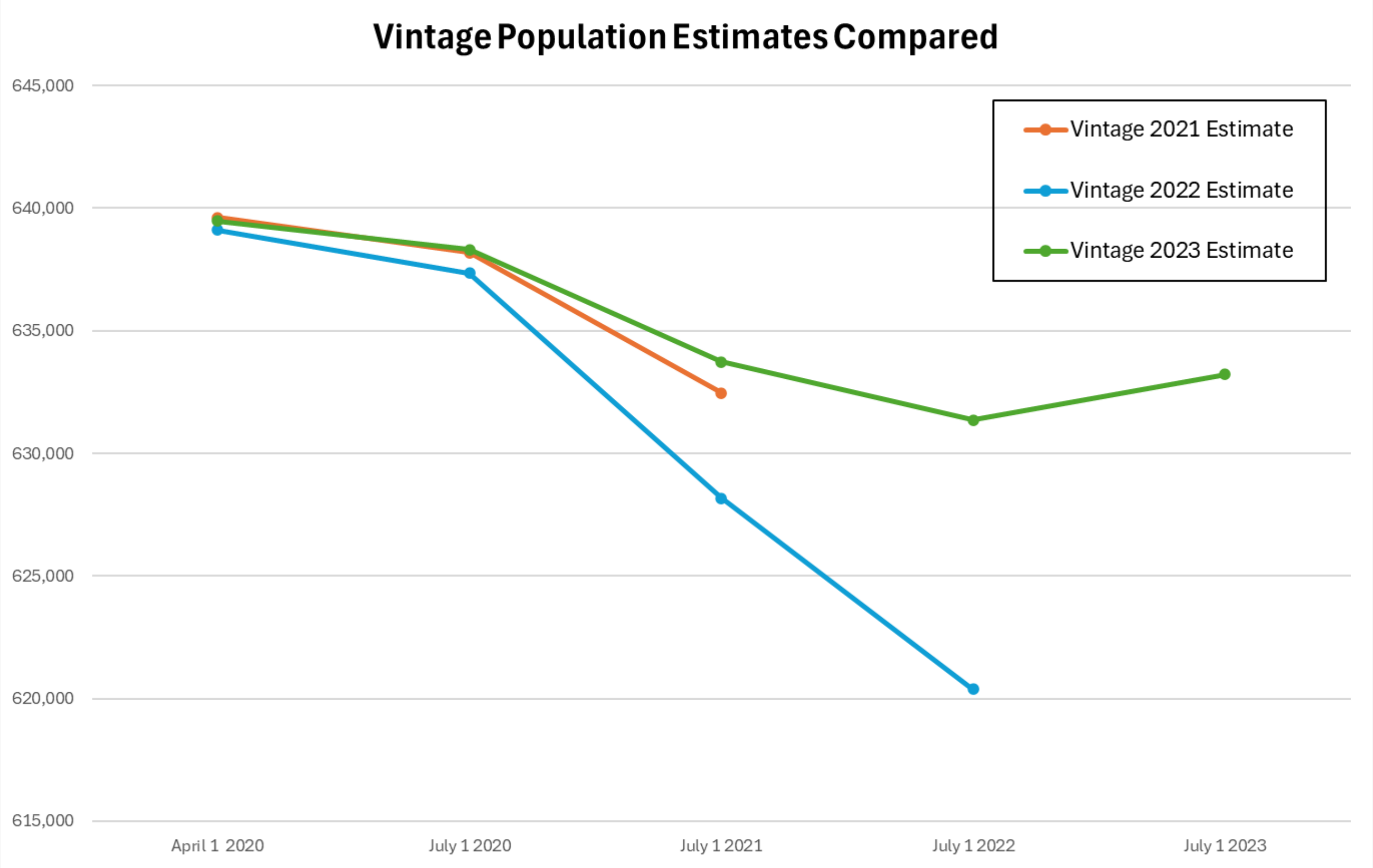

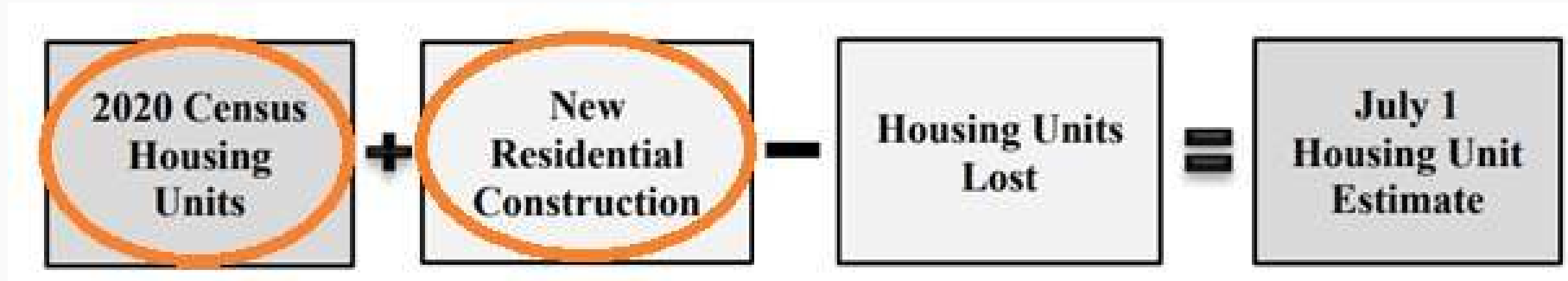

The Population Estimates program uses building permit data to estimate the number of new housing units.

In Detroit, there were properties that didn't meet the Census Bureau's criteria for a housing unit during the 2020 Census, but were rehabbed after the Census by people who didn't pull a permit. These properties should be added to the 2020 Housing Unit Count, since they are now housing units.

The goal of this project is to identify permitted and non-permitted new housing units created for the City's Population Estimates Challenges.

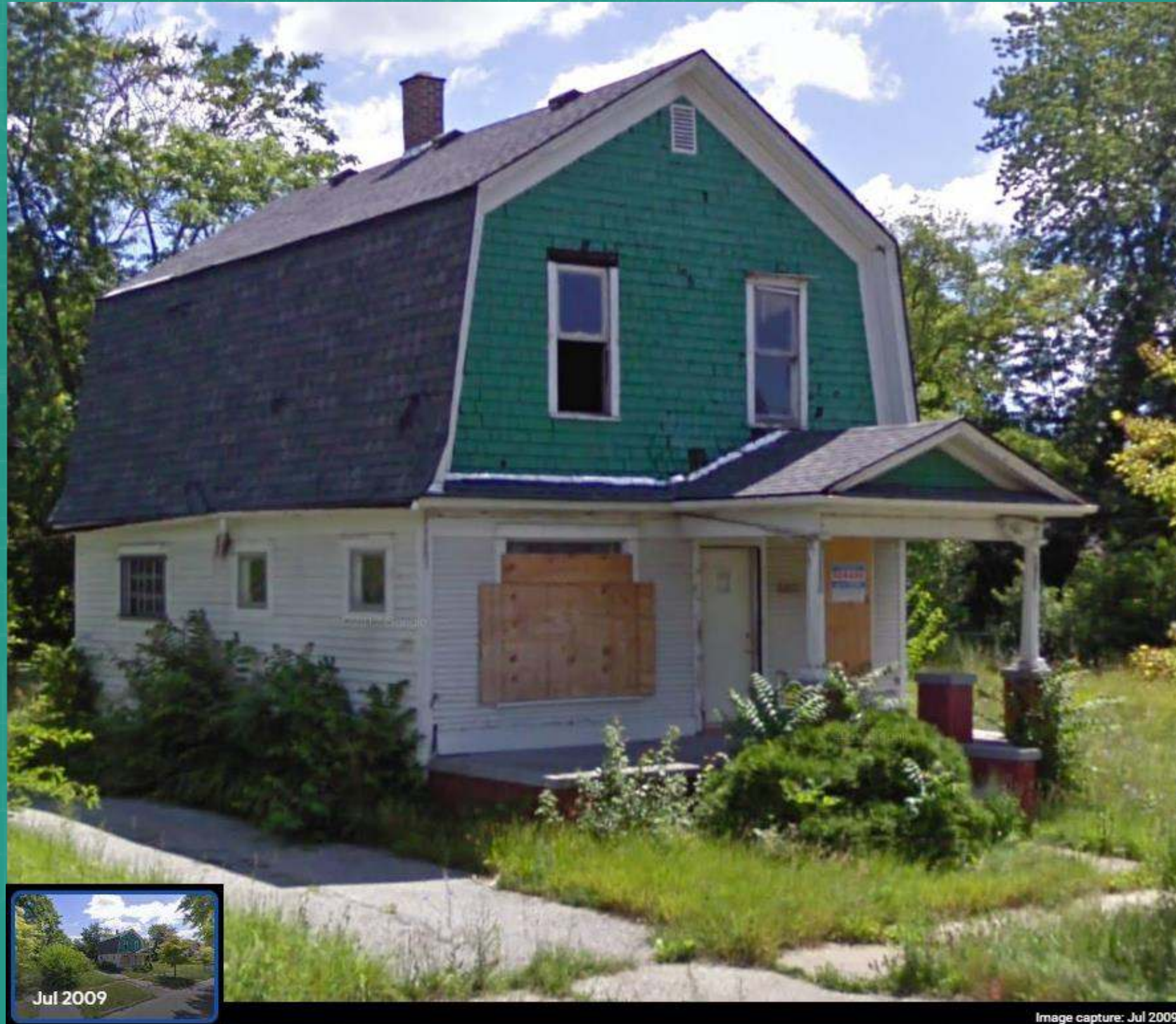

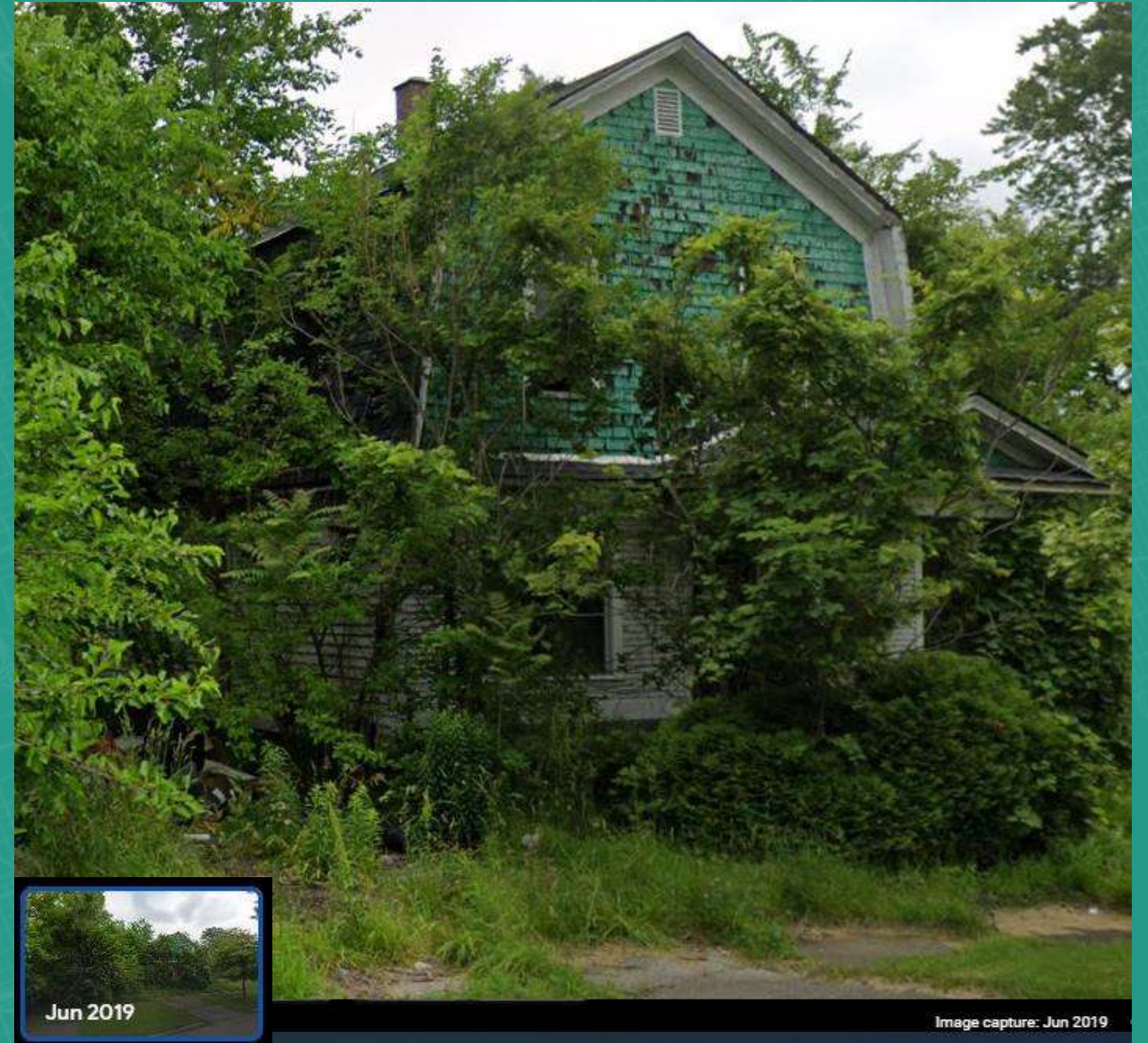

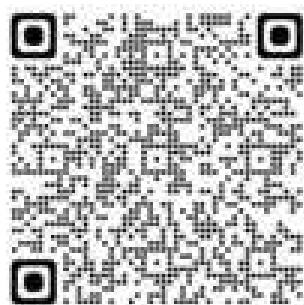

VOTE 2024 Milage & Proposal Info

Proposition A

ask voters to amend the Wayne County charter to allow an independent external auditor, selected by competitive bid, to serve for a term of three years or more. The county has long had a team of outside auditors who review the finances of various county departments.

Proposal L

is the 10-year renewal of the Library's millage of 3.9943 mills, that expires on June 30, 2025. This critical funding provides approximately 85% of the Library's operating funds.

Proposition P

will ask voters to renew a millage for improving various parks in the county. A "yes" vote supports reviewing the 2020 millage at a 2023 rollback rate of 0.2442 mills, about \$0.24 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation of a property for five years, from 2026 to 2030. A "no" vote would end the funding.
