OUR HISTORY

One out of every three people in Detroit have a conviction on their record, which creates barriers to opportunities like employment, housing, and education.

It used to be unnecessarily difficult and expensive to receive a criminal record expungement. That's why Mayor Duggan created Project Clean Slate (PCS) in 2016. PCS handles the process for Detroiters from start to finish - for free!

In 2021, new legislation championed by Mayor Duggan made eligibility requirements for expungement easier. That, in turn, expanded the number of Detroiters that could apply for the program. Over 30,000 Detroiters have registered for PCS since 2016,



OUR PROGRESS

Despite having a small staff, since 2016 PCS has significantly increased the number of Detroiters with whom we work. This graph shows the number of expungements from our first year through today:

OUR FUTURE

10,000 expungements is a lot, but it isn't nearly enough for us. This year, PCS plans to expunge another 5,000 convictions, and file 4,000 expungement applications.

There are thousands of Detroiters who are eligible to receive expungement, and PCS wants to make sure that each of them has access to the opportunities that expungement provides.

PCS has grown a lot since 2016, hiring more staff and streamlining our processes with courts to make sure that receiving an expungement through us is a quick and easy process.

We look forward to our continued growth while serving Detroit!

Richard Walker, son of former Detroit Lion Dick "Night Train" Lane, was facing life in prison, and his defense lawyer wanted to make sure that he got it. That's because his lawyer stole \$40,000 from Richard and hid evidence that would have proven his innocence. Richard was sentenced to life in prison, but never gave up hope, continuing to fight for his freedom behind bars. Eventually, Richard was resentenced and released from prison. His lawyer was disbarred, but Richard's criminal conviction remained.

With the help of Project Clean Slate, Richard was able to expunge his record in 2024. He accompanied the PCS team to a Federal Bar Association event, where he spoke about his experience in the criminal justice system and his expungement with PCS. By chance, Richard was seated next to retired Judge Timothy Kenny, who happened to be the Prosecutor on his decades-old case. Judge Kenny and Richard had an impactful conversation and discovered a way they can work together. Judge Kenny sits on the Board of the Wayne County Jail Ministry and is working to connect returning citizens to the Dick Night Train Lane Career Center, an organization Richard created to empower individuals through the development of marketable job skills.
