Recommendations will focus on aligning land use policy with:

- A shared vision for Detroit's future
- Infrastructure, transportation, economic development and other strategic priorities



LAND USE ANALYSIS

WHAT IS IT?

Deeper dive into existing land use patterns and how they relate to current policy, planning priorities, and zoning

HELPS US ANSWER BIG QUESTIONS LIKE:

- How can Detroit align transit investment and development opportunities to support strong neighborhoods and job centers?
- Where and how should Detroit strengthen its commercial corridors based on their current performance and future potential?
- How should Detroit position its industrial land to capture emerging economic opportunities?



We will discuss policy through internal and public conversations

Conversations will build on each other and both will meaningfully contribute to the draft policies

Internal Stakeholders

City staff representatives from various departments

Key agencies (e.g, DEGC, DLBA, DBA) that frequently collaborate with the City on projects

Public Stakeholders

Community subject matter experts – based on their lived experience, work, or passion

Residents from all 7 Council districts
